

## Adobe Scan

This is a handy app for scanning work using your mobile phone.

It's free to download on apple and android, and you just log in using facebook or google.

### ACES tips for using Adobe Scan

- Best just to have a play with it to get the hang of it, but essentially you pop the piece of work on the floor in good light (fluorescent light can blanch it a bit if there's a lot of white so maybe test) and then hover the phone over it as if to take a photo.
- You'll notice wee blue dots as the app finds the corners of the work. It'll then automatically take a 'photo'.
- The app automatically crops, warps etc to give a flat scan and you can save it as a pdf.
- Then you can share via email, dropbox etc or (airdrop to apple devices).
- Once it's on the computer it's a little fiddly – you need to open it and export it as another file type to convert it to jpeg if you need to do any photoshop work.
- If it's good to go straight from the app then just taking a screenshot/snip will probably be enough and you can copy/paste it into your powerpoint.
