- Performance (grades, attendance/punctuality, deadlines) and personal attributes (dedication, commitment, hard work)

Single application fee will no longer be available so fee for 2024 will be £27.50





UCAS – 5 choices

- Options:
 - 1 course at 5 different universities
 - 1 university with 5 different courses
 - Combination of different courses at different universities
- 1 personal statement for all 5 choices
- Complete thorough course and university research
- Make realistic choices
- Be confident that your choices meet your personal requirements







Entry Requirements

- Have you met the minimum entry requirements (grades, including Nat 5s/Highers and essential subjects)?
- Are you predicted above the minimum entry requirement?
- Widening Access Contextual Admissions policy
- Work experience is it essential?
- Have you taken part in extracurricular activities?
- Do you have a good understanding of the course/sector?
- Have you demonstrated your enthusiasm for the course/subject?





Crafting your personal statement

- Course choices
- Studies and other achievements
- Work experience and volunteering
- Hobbies and interests
- Career and/or further study aspirations





Linking strengths to course

- ABC
 - Activity What have you done?
 - Benefit What skills, knowledge or experience has it given you?
 - Course How does that relate to your chosen course?
- Example Social Work
 - A: Part time work at hotel
 - B: Communicating with the public, handling difficult situations
 - C: Working as part of an interdisciplinary team and communicating with a diverse range of community members.





Personal Statement

\rightarrow	Check your spelling and grammar	\rightarrow	Waste space listing courses
\rightarrow	Be clear and concise	\rightarrow	Be over the top and unrealistic
\rightarrow	Make relevant links to your chosen	\rightarrow	Use colloquial language
	course	\rightarrow	Use cliché openings
\rightarrow	Include extracurricular activities	\rightarrow	Mention one particular university if
\rightarrow	Show interest in the curriculum		applying to others
\rightarrow	Use the full text allowance	\rightarrow	Be too short of vague
\rightarrow	Have good structure and flow	\rightarrow	Plagiarise
\rightarrow	Be positive
