Sanctuary Support Fund 2024-25 (the "Scholarship")

Key Facts Document

This Key Facts Document sets out the main details of the Scholarship, as at date of publication. This document should be reviewed alongside the <u>University of Dundee Scholarship Terms and Conditions</u>, as those terms and conditions will provide you with additional information that apply to you in respect of the Scholarship.

Date of publication	March 2024, applicable to 2024/5 academic year (September 2024 entry).
Application Process	There is no specific application form for the Scholarship.
	2. There is a limited number of awards. As such, your eligibility will be assessed by our Scholarships team.
	3. We use information detailed on an Applicant's course application to determine if they meet the eligibility criteria for this Scholarship.
	4. Please note that a change of name, misspelling, or other changes in information can affect Admissions records and may mean that you will not receive scholarship updates.
	5. Please note that eligibility is assessed at the time of the application and will not be re-evaluated post matriculation.
	6. All documents submitted must be officially translated into English to enable verification. The certified translation should be completed by a professional translator/translation company and include:
	details of the translator/translation company's credentials;
	confirmation that it is an accurate translation of the original document;
	the translator/translation company's contact details;
	date of translation;
	 original signature of the translator or an authorised official of the translation company
	7. Any applicant who has notified the University of their nationality and residence status, but who has not provided evidence to support this by the deadline of the scholarship, will be deemed ineligible and their application form will not be considered.

Who is eligible?	To be eligible for this Scholarship you must:
	 Have an Unconditional Offer to study a full-time, on campus Postgraduate course of 180 credits per year in any school at the University of Dundee for September 2024.
	2. Have firmly accepted your Unconditional Offer.
	3. a) Be a national of and currently residing in one of the following countries:
	SyriaPalestineUkraine
	Or
	b) Be a national of one of the following countries, whilst not being domiciled or otherwise normally residence in that country (documentary proof of nationality and residence status will be required):
	 Syria Palestine Ukraine Afghanistan
	4. Have applied to study a course which has an associated full-time tuition fee of £21,900 per year or above (Medical Education MMed applicants are also eligible with a tuition fee of £19,640).
	5. Be starting your course in September 2024.
	6. Hold International Fee Status.
	7. If the applicant has applied for a Part-Time or Distance Learning programme, then they are not eligible for this scheme.
	 8. Courses not eligible for this support fund: • Endodontics MDSc • Human Clinical Embryology MSc • Prosthodontics MDSc
Award Information	The value of the scholarship is a reduction of International fees to Home Scottish-level fees.
	2. The scholarship will reset the level of fees you will be liable to pay to Home Scottish-level fees for PGT courses.
	3. The programme of study must be a postgraduate taught programme of study - Research and Undergraduate programmes are not included.



- 4. If you are successful in being selected for this scholarship, you will be issued with an updated Offer Letter clarifying the new fee amount you would be required to pay.
- 5. The University has a specific number of awards available according to the funding allocated for that academic year so it cannot guarantee that each Applicant from the countries listed in the eligibility section will receive this award.
- 6. Each month we will assess the number of applicants eligible for this award and where the number of eligible applicants exceeds the number of available places, we will employ academic selection to award a specific number of recipients.

Key Information

- 1. Successful eligible applicants under this scholarship will have tuition fees set at the same level as those of Scottish students.
- 2. If an applicant has an externally funded scholarship that covers part of the full tuition fee, this can be awarded alongside one or more University of Dundee scholarships (provided that the total of the awards combined does not exceed the total UoD tuition fee).
- 3. Should an applicant wish to defer their entry to the University of Dundee, the following rules apply:
 - a. Deferral within the same academic year: Scholarship can also be deferred.
 - b. Deferral to a new academic year: Scholarship <u>cannot</u> be deferred.
- 4. Changes to the course of study:
 - a. If an applicant changes Course before, during or after matriculation, the University of Dundee reserves the right to re-assess eligibility for scholarships and may retract the Scholarship Offer should an applicant's eligibility have changed.
 - b. If an applicant changes Fee status or any other personal information before, during or after matriculation, the University of Dundee reserves the right to re-assess eligibility for scholarships and may retract the Scholarship Offer should an applicant's eligibility have changed.
- 5. If an applicant has paid their tuition fees in full prior to being awarded the Sanctuary Support Fund Scholarship, the fee difference will be refunded to the applicant after they have matriculated at the University of Dundee.
- 6. All communication with the student will be via email, to their @dundee.ac.uk email address. We may also communicate with other email addresses provided to us by the applicant. Types of communication may be:
 - a. Confirming the scholarship.
 - b. Informing the applicant that they have not met the criteria to be awarded the scholarship.



- c. Requesting further information.
- 7. The University of Dundee is unable to disclose details of the scholarship to anyone other than the applicant unless consent is given by the applicant to do so.
- 8. The University reserves the right to withdraw the scholarship immediately and without notice where the student is determined by the University to have misled the University about any aspect of eligibility to receive the scholarship.
- 9. If the student withdraws from the programme, they must notify the Registry Team that they are no longer enrolled at the University of Dundee.
- 10. Should a student withdraw from their programme of study, the University of Dundee Fees department may be in contact regarding payment of fees and scholarship balance.
- 11. The University of Dundee will not back-date any awards, and all awards made will be current and apply to the student pre matriculation only.
- 12. All scholarship decisions are final and cannot be appealed.
